When I discovered General Semantics about 16 years ago; I did not have the luxury of reading "Korzybski--A Biography. Now Bruce Kodish is not paying me to write this; but on page 413 and 414, an aspiring General Semanticist will find an astounding account of Korzybski himself; honing his craft and alleviating a "hallucination" one of his patients had incurred during an episode of sexual abuse when she was a child. Page 456 of Science and Sanity describes the "hallucination" and goes into detail about it. Page 390 of S & S explains the structural differential and the levels of abstractions. In his 'therapy' with the patient; Korzybski cleverly and intuitively plucks out an "indentification" which was plaguing his patient and went on through several levels of abstractions to get the client to contact her "hallucination" and purge it. This had to be the most interesting example of a workable method I have ever read about anywhere. Reading that will give anyone new to GS, and idea of how potent this method is and clearly circumscribes the genius of Korzybski.

The book "Korzybski--A Biography is a must read and a complement to Science and Sanity.
